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
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


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The other interesting fact about these trials is that we consistently show that optimum and maximum economic N rate is between 100-150 lbs./ac. Anything else above this may slightly increase yield but is not profitable. If you don't like this data, sorry. We can't alter facts. Are there exceptions? Always! However, whether we place these test on sandy soils, heavy mineral soils, or organic soils, it seems that we tend to have optimum yield very near the NC RYE recommendations.

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Question: Why can't you look up my hours for me?

Answer: There are many reasons this does not happen. First, as noted above, it requires login information. Since computers automatically record personal data and login information for re-use, we must be careful to ensure our systems do not inadvertently acquire and store anyone else's personal data. We go to extremes to do such! Secondly, there are over 50,000 individuals within NC that have such a license. Our mandate states that should we provide a service or educational event, we offer it to everyone. We simply lack time and other resources to provide over 50,000 people with their current credit hours. Lastly, there may be (and almost always seems to be) some discrepancy regarding your records and what is online. As such, each individual must clarify this information on their own. We cannot do this for you.

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
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
