Objectives of the Chicken Project Record Book

- 1. To gain knowledge and experience caring for poultry
- 2. To learn responsibility
- 3. To learn record keeping skills

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Things to keep in mind about the project:

- This project is for the child to explore and discover project areas.
- The completed Chicken Project Record Book will be judged as part of the Regional Chicken Project competition.
- Regional Chicken Project participants will participate in poultry showmanship at the show in a class of appropriate age group.
- The responsibility of animal ownership should not lie solely with the child, but with the parents and/or advisor also.

Rules of activity:

- Alf completed Chicken Project Books must be turned into the county agent or Ag
 teacher/advisor on <u>April 16,2021</u> in order to be eligible to compete for awards
 on the day of the show.
- 2. Alf sections of the Chicken Project Record book must be completed in order to be eligible to compete in the Chicken Showmanship and Breed Competitions.
- 3. Record keeping about your chicken(s) begins on the date that you start preparing to receive your chicks until date of show.
- 4. Be mindful of page limitations and guidelines for each section. Do not submit Chicken Project Record Books in binders or notebooks, but folders are acceptable.
- 5. All signatures must be obtained on the front of this Chicken Project Book.
- 6. All work must be done by the submitting 4-H, Ag Ed student or FFA member. Plagiarism is not allowed. Project Record Books that appear to be plagiarized will be disqualified and ineligible for awards. (We want to see the children's handwriting if possible.)
- Portions of the Chicken Project Record Book may be submitted to other project book competitions at the county, district, region or state level for further awards. Please see your 4-H Agent.


